



Alice Mildred Singleton

January 30, 1922 - October 1, 2020

Longtime Yreka resident Alice Mildred Singleton passed away on October 1, 2020 after a lengthy illness. She was 98 years old.

Alice was born on January 30, 1922 in Bandera, Texas to Sterling and Mary Davis. The family moved to Van Nuys when Alice was one year old. She graduated from Van Nuys High School in 1940.
