



Charles "Dick" Richard Mayberry

December 30, 1932 - February 18, 2022

Longtime Siskiyou County resident, Charles Richard "Dick" Mayberry passed away peacefully at home on February 18, 2022 at 89 years of age.

Dick was born on December 30, 1932 in Lindsay, California to Earl Mayberry and Elizabeth Lawyer. He is survived by his wife of 64 years, Maggie; children Chuck (Penny) Mayberry of Peoria, Arizona and Katy (Craig) Allen of Weed; grandchildren Alyssa (Justin) Smith, Kristy Mayberry, Anna and Mary Allen; 2 great-grandchildren; nephews Phil (Angie) Mayberry and Justin (Melanie) Mayberry; and niece Susan Benitez. He was preceded in death by his parents, his brother Gordon Mayberry, niece Linda Gomez, and granddaughter Megan Allen.

After graduating from Lindsay High School, Dick served in the Navy on the USS Yancey during the Korean War. After his discharge, he played catcher for the Lewiston Broncs baseball team. He attended College of the Sequoias, where he played football and baseball, as well as sang in school musicals and with the Sons of the San Joaquin. It was at COS where he met the love of his life, Maggie, and they were married in 1957.

The family moved to Siskiyou County in 1964, where Dick worked in the cattle and horse business on several ranches in the area. He volunteered with the 4-H, youth sports, and church activities. His deep bass voice was frequently

heard in church solos and cheering on the home teams from the stands at football and basketball games.
