Lee was raised in Burlington where he graduated from High School and later joined the Marine Corp. He served in the Korean War from 1952-1953 and was honorably discharged as a Corporal.

Living in Sacramento, Lee was a communications operator for the federal government for 12 years before moving to Yreka in 1969 to raise their kids. Lee was a molder feeder at Klamath Molding Co. and Georgia Pacific before retiring in 1988. He also worked part time at Siskiyou Bowling Lanes.

Lee was also known as that cheerful greeter at Wal-Mart who was always whistling and giving the customers directions. He also loved bowling, picking blackberries and catching fish (or at least feeding them.)

Lee is survived by his wife, Sue; son, Chad and his children Miranda and Joshua and his daughter and son-in-law, Linda and David Johnson. He was preceded in death by his parents, Gladys and Doyle and his two brothers, Forest and Gerald.
