



## Dennis Eugene Ray

March 22, 1929 - February 15, 2019

Longtime Yreka resident Dennis Eugene Ray passed away on February 15, 2019 at Fairchild Medical Center in Yreka. He was 89 years old.

Dennis was born on March 22, 1929 in Chico to Charles and Eleanor Ray. He grew up in Chico and served in the U.S. Air Force. He attended Chico State, where he earned his Bachelor's Degree as a chemistry major. He later obtained his teaching degree. In the summer of 1959, Dennis married Sylvia Herrera, and the couple moved to Yreka, where they both taught at Yreka High School. Dennis taught math, and later started teaching computer programming before retiring in 1988. Dennis kept busy after retirement, including teaching a computer class for adults. He enjoyed photography and working with stained glass. He also loved to take the family on long road trips, including Alaska and Washington DC.

Dennis was preceded in death by his wife, Sylvia in 1994, and a son, Douglas, in 1982. He is survived by his wife of 20 years, Louise, and a son Alex Ray of San Francisco.

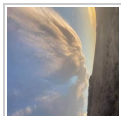
