Lifelong Happy Camp resident Donald Alan Zink passed away on March 4, 2020 in Happy Camp surrounded by his family. He was 88 years old.

Don was born on January 29, 1932 in Yreka to Harvey and Merle Zink. He married his wife, Gail Gordon Zink in 1951, and together they had five children.

Don loved his family, baseball, hunting, fishing and music. In the 1950's Don enjoyed playing baseball in the Siskiyou County baseball league. He played the trumpet in several bands during the 50's and 60's. Don worked as a timber faller for many years. He was very active in the Happy Camp community. Don coached Babe Ruth baseball and worked tirelessly building a youth baseball field in Happy Camp for the teams to play on. Don and Gail were founding members of the Happy Camp High School Booster Club.

Don is survived by five children, Connie Rasmussen, Mark Zink, Tim Zink, Christy DeBonis and Dennis Zink, 13 grandchildren, 15 great grandchildren and two great-great grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his wives, Gail Gordon Zink in 1990 and Leora Zink in 2010, and two siblings, Marilyn Davis and Harvey Zink.
