



Donna Jean Hibshman

May 19, 1932 - February 27, 2021

Donna Jean was born on May 19, 1932 to Clarence and Bertha Lipprand in Russell, Kansas. She was the oldest of three children. She grew up on the family farm in Russell County, Kansas.

The love of the farm remained in her heart throughout her life. Donna's parents were avid students of the Bible, and they taught her the value of Bible principles. In the 1940's, Donna was expelled from school because of her neutral stand in politics. Among her fondest memories was attending the historic Bible Convention in 1941 in St. Louis, Missouri, where she was among 15,000 children who received the "Children's Book" from Joseph Rutherford. This made a lasting impression on her heart and mind. She was baptized as one of Jehovah's on October 1, 1944.

After marrying Harry Hibshman in 1950, they raised 4 children on their family farm in Russell, where hard work was implemented. Not only did she work hard on their farm, but she also worked at a local dairy, milking cows for over 20 years.

Donna moved to Yreka, California in 1992, and remained there until she died at the age of 88.

Donna was preceded in death by her parents, her brother, Morgan Lipprand,

and by her daughter-in-law, Lynn (wife of Nathan).

Donna is survived by her sister Joyce White of Kimball, Nebraska; children Becky (Robert) Smith of Yreka, Nathan Hibshman of Yreka, Joel (Kristine) Hibshman of Montague, Troy (Renee) Hibshman of Forks, Washington; 8 grandchildren, 6 great-grandchildren, and 2 great-great-grandchildren.

Donna deeply appreciated the Bible's hope of living on a paradise earth (Psalms 37: 10-11). It is our prayer that we will see her again when that hope is realized by means of the resurrection of the dead.
