82 year old Ennis Dean Borg, of Gazelle, passed away unexpectedly on Saturday, March 1, 2014 at his home.

Ennis was born to Linden and Inez Borg in Hampden, North Dakota, on June 19, 1931. Ennis proudly served in the United States Marine Corps during the Korean War. Ennis had lived in Gazelle for the last 20 years after making the move from Redding, where he worked for Gallino Construction for many years. Later in life, Ennis became an avid farmer and rancher. He raised many sheep and worked with a variety of animals at his home in Gazelle.
