August 2, 1937 - March 14, 2017

Lifelong Siskiyou County resident Ernest P. Roberts passed away on March 14, 2017 at his home in Montague, surrounded by his family. He was 79 years old.

Ernie was born on August 2, 1937 in Yreka to Ernest and Anne Roberts. He graduated from Happy Camp High School, and married his high school sweetheart, Jeanette Woolweber on September 28, 1957 in Happy Camp. Ernie worked for many years in the lumber mills in Seiad Valley and Yreka as a lumber grader. He was a wood cutting fanatic, and loved working in his yard. He coached his children in baseball, was active in the Montague Baseball Association, and was an umpire in the Yreka softball leagues. He and Jeanette enjoyed camping and their trips to Reno.
