Fawn Star Hullquist passed away on May 16, 2015 in Yreka. She was born on September 23, 1932 at Ukonom Lake, California. Fawn was raised in Mtn. View, CA by her parents Evald and Eunice Lindholm. Fawn graduated from Mtn. View High School in 1950. She met and married her husband Wilbur Hullquist of Fort Jones on November 10, 1951.

Fawn worked at Siskiyou Telephone from 1966 to 1992, retiring in that year. She loved flowers, glassware and animals, especially her cat "Mr. Bibbs".

Fawn was a member of the Rebecca Lodge, Daughters of the Revolution and Native Daughters of the Golden West. She volunteered at the Fort Jones Museum and Siskiyou Genealogy Society during her retirement.

Fawn was preceded in death by her husband, Wilbur, in 2003; her son Sheldon in 1955; her brother Gerald in 2004 and her sister, Joanne Eastlick, earlier this year.

She leaves her sons, Brent and partner, Anita, Kevin and his wife, Victoria, and Gary and his wife, Chris. In addition, she leaves four grandsons, Niels of Moscow ID, Mason of Callahan, Tyler of Mt. Shasta and Everett of Yreka; one granddaughter, Grace, of Fort Jones and 2 great-grandchildren, Brenden and Ashley of Moscow, ID. She also leaves her brother and sister-in-law, Greg and

Betty Lindholm of Greenview, her brother-in-law Rod Eastlick of Quartz Valley and numerous nieces and nephews.
