



## Jacqueline Jean Dooley

March 16, 1930 - July 8, 2012

Jacqueline Jean Dooley, 82 year old long time Siskiyou County resident, passed away on Sunday morning, July 8, 2012 after becoming ill on Saturday. Jacqueline was born March 16, 1930 in Clifton, Arizona and came to Siskiyou County as a very young girl. She grew up on the Middle Fork of Humbug Creek and attended grammar school in Humbug and graduated from Yreka High School. She worked at the Yreka Theater while in high school and later worked for the county schools as a substitute teacher, a teacher's aide and as the librarian, retiring in 1980.

On December 15, 1947, Jacqueline married Lester "Ike" Dooley in Medford, Oregon and the couple made their home in Yreka except for a time in Modoc County from 1948 to 1958. After Jacqueline retired, she would travel with Ike as he worked on road construction until he retired in 1986. Ike passed away on August 13, 1989.

Jacqueline was a member of the Retired Public Employees Association and the Ladies Auxiliary to the Veterans of Foreign Wars. She enjoyed reading, gardening and country music and especially enjoyed crocheting blankets for her grandchildren.

Survivors include her 3 sons and their spouses, Michael and Ginger of Yreka, Dan and Teri of Grenada and Ken and Patty of Yreka; her brother, Lee Crouch, of Redding; 7 grandchildren; 2 step grandchildren; 6 great grandchildren; 6 step great grandchildren and 1 on the way. She was preceded in death by two sisters, Ethel Beck and Colleen Babcock.
