Jacqueline Coy "Jacque" Reid passed away on October 17, 2016 at the Madrone Hospice House in Yreka. She was 80 years old, and a 29 year resident of Siskiyou County.

Jacque was born on August 22, 1936 in Los Angeles to Lloys and Aurora Reid. Jacque was an only child, and worked for 40 years in the book publishing business as a clerk and an editor. She spent much of her adult life in San Jose before moving to Yreka in the late 1980's.

Jacque enjoyed gardening and was a master of plants and herbs. She was quite artistic: a talented painter in a variety of mediums and an array of paint types, and an accomplished poet and writer of short stories. One of Jacque's favorite hobbies outside of gardening and the arts was playing her computer with her grandchildren and perusing the various social media sites. Jacqueline was a member of the Catholic Church during her time in San Jose, and became a member of St. Joseph's Parrish in Yreka after moving to Siskiyou County. She was also a founding member of the Bach Dancing and Dynamite Society. Jacque spent many years participating as a project leader in her children's 4-H Club.

Jacque was truly bright, intelligent, and talented to anybody who knew her; and those who knew her best knew her as humble and gracious. She was a

fine example of the right kind of person, and almost everyone enjoyed her company. She was known by her motto: “love is kind,” and was more than just a mother to her children, but was also a best friend and confidant.

Jacqueline is survived by her four children: Jennifer (Wally) Johnson of Yreka, Valerie (Chuck) Linfoot of Klamath River, William Bragg of Seiad Valley, and Daniel Gelinske of Yreka; seven grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren.
