James C. Robinson, born on Jan. 16, 1925 in Redding, Calif. to Clarence I. and Doris M. Robinson, passed away on Friday, June 25, 2010 of congestive heart failure. Jim moved to Yreka with his parents and brother Bill in 1935 and graduated from Yreka High School in 1942. While attending Chico State College in 1943, he was drafted into the Army and served overseas until his honorable discharge in December 1945. In 1951, he married Jacquith (Jackie) A. Pruet. Together, they owned and operated Jim Robinson Backhoe Service as well as building and operating Waiiaka Trailer Haven, until their retirement in 1990. Jackie preceded him in death in 2005. In 2006, he was blessed to meet Kathy Hamm, and in 2007 they were married. As an active member of the Yreka community, he was noted as a local historian as well as being involved in numerous activities such as square dancing, fishing, hunting, traveling and gardening. He also served in many capacities as a longtime member of the Yreka United Methodist Church. Jim is survived by his wife Kathy Robinson; his daughters Susan Perkins and Celia Crutchfield; his sons-in-law Lee Perkins and Jon Crutchfield; and his brother William I. Robinson.
