After high school, Jessie and her sister Anita went to Seattle, as there were lots of jobs. Jessie worked as a messenger at a naval base. There she met Larry Fraser, her future husband. There was not much she couldn't do. Jessie and Larry enjoyed riding their Indian motorcycles. They enjoyed fishing, hunting, camping, and trips to the coast. She was active in PTA, cub scouts, bible studies and all her kids' sports events. She held bible studies in her home. Wearing her handmade apron, she lovingly took care of about

twelve children while their mothers studied the bible. She had them under control, with healthy snacks, art or craft activities and games. She loved children and animals. She was precious. So gifted in many things and so people oriented. Jessie loved to work outside and keep a beautiful yard and garden. She worked as a nurse's aide at the hospital, retail stores and fabric shops throughout her life. Jessie was blessed with 12 grandchildren, 28 great grandchildren, and one great great grandchild. Jessie's joy was to be with her family, meeting their needs and creating a loving home. Jessie had a strong Christian faith and instilled that faith in all her family.
