John loved to butcher animals, especially pigs. He shared many hunting adventures with his friend Mike Skeahan, and his life-long friend, Fred Lange, who was by his side until the very end.

Known for infectious laughter and a hot temper, John had a knack for humor and an unwavering willingness to lend his helping hand. His radiant smile and loud voice filled every room, and in all of his endeavors he was the epitome of excellence. John was preceded in death by his parents, Georgia Hawley and Elmer Rider; his siblings Jean Skeahan and Everson Rider; and his nephews Charlie Rider, Stacy Lange, and Randy Rider.
