Larry is preceded in death by his mother Darlene Henninger, father Dennis Henninger, step-father Jack Gillock, and his sister Lennette.

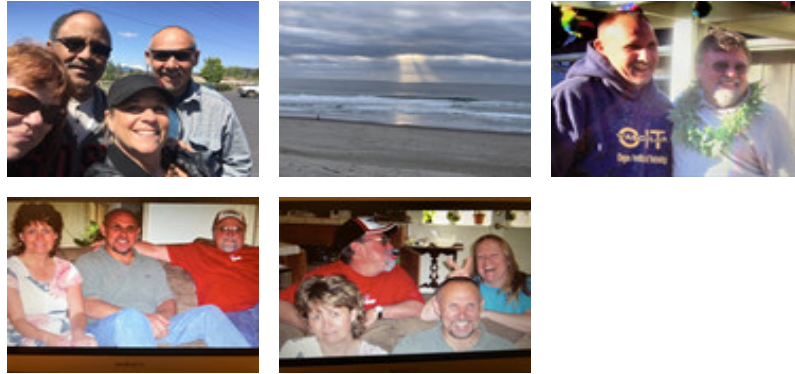
