



Lawrence George Osborne Jr.

February 2, 1935 - August 31, 2014

Longtime Siskiyou County resident Lawrence George Osborne passed away August 31, 2014 at his home in Klamath River. He was 79 years old.

Larry was the second child born to Lawrence and Mary Osborne of San Francisco. After serving in the U.S. Army, Larry began a long career with Pacific Bell in April of 1955. He worked part time with the Sheriff's Department for one year while still working for Pac Bell. He transferred from a lineman to a splicer, then diligently worked his way into management. Larry worked for American Bell International in Iran from 1978-1979. After he retired from Pac Bell, he moved to Klamath River, where he owned and operated the Sportsmans Lodge until he sold it in 1997. Larry loved Jesus Christ and was a member of Horse Creek Community Church until his illness prevented his attendance.

Larry is survived by his wife of nineteen years, Sheri Osborne, of Klamath River; a son, Lonnie Osborne and a daughter, Laura Hamilton, both of California; a brother, Lance Osborne of Santa Clara; a sister, Laureen Tomlinson of Modesto; a stepdaughter, Valerie Palmer of Coos Bay, Oregon; his stepmother, Marie Osborne of Saratoga; seven grandchildren and seven great grandchildren.

A memorial service will be held on Saturday, September 27, 2014 at 1:00 PM at the Horse Creek Community Church in Horse Creek. Larry has been laid to rest at the Chapel of the Chimes Memorial Park in Hayward, California.
