



## Lenora "Babe" Mulvany

January 26, 1920 - November 16, 2014

Lifelong Siskiyou County resident, Lenora Mae "Babe" Mulvany, at the age of 94, passed away peacefully at her home in Weed on Sunday, November 16, 2014 surrounded by her loving family.

Lenora was born in Hawkinsville, California on January 26, 1920 to Antone and Emily DeAvilla; she was the youngest of 13 children.
