



## Macon Marlow Kilpatrick Jr.

September 26, 1936 - March 29, 2021

Longtime Fort Jones resident Macon Marlow Kilpatrick Jr. passed away on March 29, 2021 at his home. He was 84 years old.

Macon, known to his family as Marlow, and to his friends as Mac, was born in Goldthwaite, Texas to Macon and F. Delphine Kilpatrick on September 26, 1936. He served in the United States Air Force during the Korean Police Action of the 1950's, where he served as a photographer. He attended various colleges taking engineering and computer graphics courses, and obtained a degree in business in Queensland, Australia. Macon worked for many years as a tool designer for Aerojet of Folsom, California. He retired to Fort Jones at the age of 77 after working at Aerojet for the previous thirty-two years. He sold real estate at various times and owned his own real estate office in Brisbane, Queensland, Australia. Macon also lived in Texas and Massachusetts.

Macon's interests included photography, flying (he owned a Piper Tri-pacer), boating (he owned a Fisher pontoon boat), riding his Yamaha motor scooter or his Honda quad or his 1977 Lincoln Continental, playing computer solitaire and chess, and watching news, nature, history and police programs on television. He loved to see new places and traveled extensively.

Macon is survived by three sons, Craig (Ellen), Scott (Meleese) and Darryl (Sandra); a sister, Maxine Bouback, and nieces and nephews Catherine

Webber (Ronald), Cynthia Maze, Lyle Hale (Jennifer) and Kimberly Hale; eight grandchildren, Brian (Heidi), Bethany, Joshua (Anne), Rhys (Tamara), Caleb (Jessica), Mikaela (Heath), Shinnay and Elijah, and eight great grandchildren, Jameson, Brixton, Scott, Meleese, Jackson, Dakota, Alessia and Frankie. He was preceded in death by his parents, his wife of 61 years, Marilyn Kilpatrick, a sister, Frances Ott, and a nephew Steven Hightower (Angela).
