Her Memorial Service was Sunday, April 19, 2015 at St. Mark's Preservation Square which she had planned with friends Ron and Gloria Chunn and Curtis Westbrook directing the service and included music by David Penner with songs including: Give Me Jesus, Amazing Grace, All You Have to Do Is Believe, House and the Hallalujah Chorus. The sharing of memories was a blessing for all in attendance.
