Miss Pat, as she was known to her students, taught school in Modoc and Siskiyou Counties. Later in her working career, she became a deputy sheriff in Sacramento County and owned a flower shop in Elk Grove.

Horses were a lifetime hobby and Pat was the president of the Sacramento Ladies' Mounted Patrol. Pat was president of the Scott Valley Garden Club, taught English as a second language, a member of the Grange, the Elks, the Scott Valley Dalmatians, and she served as a volunteer election official.

Pat was a welcoming site to those visiting Fairchild Medical Center, where she greeted people with fresh flowers and a twinkle in her eye. Pat was never shy in giving directions or information. She served on the Fairchild Auxiliary, and

was recently honored with 3,500 hours of service to that group.

Pat was preceded in death by the love of her life, husband William "Bill" Henry Harvey and her beloved canine friend Sadie. Both were partners in her many adventures. She also leaves her daughter Leslie Jones-Huddleston, son Joe Jr., Jim, and John Mohamed, and Bill's daughter Penni Harvey.
