



Paul Forrest Black

September 13, 1935 - November 18, 2017

Longtime Scott Valley resident Paul Forrest Black passed away on November 18, 2017 at his home in Fort Jones. He was 82 years old.

Paul was born in Yreka on September 13, 1935 to Charles and Thelma Black. He attended school in Scott Valley and graduated from Etna High School. He went to Oregon Institute of Technology in Klamath Falls where he studied cabinetry making and business, which he used throughout his life building cabinets and owning his own business "Paul Black Cabinet Works" for 50 years.

Paul was the founder and member of the Siskiyou Houndsmen and Sportsmen Club for over 50 years. He loved fishing and hunting. He especially loved hunting bear and bobcat. He got his first dog in 1961, and continued to have dogs until two weeks ago. Paul served as Siskiyou County Fish & Game Commissioner for eight years.

Paul is survived by three daughters: Larena Taylor of Redding, Zoann Barthhold of Beaumont, California and Cindy Black of Anderson, as well as step-daughter Yvonne Aven of Dawson Creek, Canada, and step-sons Rick Dean of Yreka and Russell Dean of Fort Jones; two sisters, Joann Albino of Medford and Marcel Hergoth of Redding; 11 grandchildren and 15 great grandchildren. Paul was preceded in death by his wife of 30 years, Bettie Fern

Black, in 2016.
