



Richard Chris Hanni

October 23, 1935 - June 14, 2013

Richard Chris Hanni, 77 year old Citrus Heights resident and former Yreka resident, passed away on Friday, June 14, 2013 at the Roseville Care Center in Roseville. Richard was born October 23, 1935 in San Francisco to Chris and Marie Hanni and moved to Ft. Jones when he was 8. He attended Ft. Jones schools, graduating from Ft. Jones High School.

He began his career in construction shortly after high school, working for Bud Manley. On January 7, 1959, he entered the U.S. Army, where he served for two years. While in the Army, on March 29, 1959, he married Evelyn Sabio and the couple settled in Yreka when Richard's time in the Army was over. Richard continued his career in construction, working as a site supervisor, helping to build different commercial buildings. They lived in Yreka until 1979, when they moved and lived in Colusa, Chico and Citrus Heights. Richard retired in 1995.

Richard enjoyed fishing, camping, woodworking and traveling in their R.V. Along with Evelyn, they worked as camp ground hosts and lighthouse guides at Cape Disappointment in Washington State. He was a long time member of the Yreka B.P.O. Elks Lodge, #1980.

Richard is survived by his wife, Evelyn, of Citrus Heights; four children, Christine Hanni of Sunnyvale, Richard Chris Hanni Jr. of Fresno, Tamera Karen Hanni of Willows and Sharon Rene Hanni and her husband, Stephen Fasoletti, of Chico; a brother and sister-in-law, William and Caroline Hanni of Anderson; a brother-in-law, Donald Baldocchi and seven grandchildren,

Randy and Gary Wilson, Taryn and Parker Mitchell, Chandler and Regan Fasoletti and Jacob Hanni. He was preceded in death by a sister, Alice Baldocchi.

Funeral services for Richard have been set for Wednesday, June 19, 2013 at Girdner Funeral Chapel.
