



Robert Paul Schuttpelz

July 22, 1937 - January 12, 2017

Longtime Siskiyou County resident Robert Paul Schuttpelz passed away on January 12, 2017 at Madrone Hospice in Yreka surrounded by his family. He was 79 years old.

Bob was born on July 22, 1937 in Coquille, Oregon to Paul and May Schuttpelz. He graduated from North Bend High School in 1955. He then moved to Southern California where he attended Orange Coast College from 1955-1957, where he received his associates degree in business. He was part of a four-man rowing team while attending Orange Coast. This team went to the Olympic trials at Lake Onondaga, Syracuse, New York in June of 1956. They did not qualify for the Olympics.

In 1957, he moved to Corvallis and attended OSU. He continued to row for the college. He met Carol there, and they were married in 1961. He served in the Army reserves from 1960-1966, leaving as a staff sergeant. In 1963, Bob graduated with a bachelors in Business, and in 1966, he graduated with a bachelors in pharmacy. He moved to Sunnyvale, where he raised his children and managed an independent pharmacy. In 1981, he and Carol moved to Yreka with their youngest daughters and purchased the Yreka Drug, which they owned until Carol became ill in 1992, at which time they traveled and spent time with friends and family until her death in 1994.

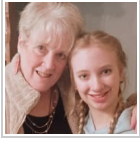
Bob met Bonnie Brodie in 1995, and quickly fell in love. They were married soon after. They would have celebrated their 20th anniversary next month.
