Siskiyou County native and longtime Yreka resident Rosalie Ruth Jorgensen passed away on December 3, 2020 in Yreka surrounded by her family. She was 82 years old.

Rosalie was born on February 13, 1938 to Frank and Mildred Graves. She grew up in Hilt and graduated from Yreka High School. In 1955, Rosalie married Robert Jorgensen in the family home in Hilt. The family felt that the couple was too young to marry, but the couple remained together for 65 years.

Rosalie was always involved with her children as they were growing up, helping with Job's Daughters, Girl Scouts, and sporting events. When the kids were older, she began working in local stores. She was a longtime clerk at Tyrer's Stationery, and she helped open the local WalMart. She was a member of the Methodist Church in both Yreka and Montague, and she volunteered at the Hospice Shop. She and Bob were longtime snowbirds, and travelled all over the country, visiting all 50 states.

Rosalie is survived by her husband, Robert; three children, Deborah Driver (Dave), Ryan Jorgensen (Gayle) and Dennis Jorgensen (Debbie); her sister, Audrey DeAvilla; seven grandchildren and nine great grandchildren.
