



Sara Sue Whipple

December 28, 1921 - January 6, 2016

Sara Sue Whipple, daughter of Robert and Gladys Burton, was born in Mugginsville December 28, 1921, and passed January 6, 2016.

She attended elementary school at Quartz Valley School. After eighth grade she attended Etna High School. Quitting school her senior year, she married Glenn Whipple October 28, 1938. When Glenn joined the Army during WWII in 1943, she worked in the flower shop in Yreka and for Penney's.

After Glenn returned home in 1946 she worked a short time for the Dept. of Motor Vehicles. In 1956, Sara Sue did bookkeeping for the family construction business. She did this until the shop closed in 1974. Sara took the Outreach Program and, in 1975, obtained her high school diploma.

Her focus always involved her family; she was often found teaching a grandchild how to fish, watching their sports activities, camping in the Marble Mountains or cooking ribs and apple pie for a family gathering.

Sara Sue is survived by her two children and families. Her son, Neil Whipple, wife, Peggy; Monte and Darby Whipple, Delaney, Myra, Mattie and Dessa; Glenda and Craig Hubbard, Halliday, Grace and Noah. Her daughter, Sherma Isbell, husband, Jim; Brett and Sarah, Blake and Aaron; Clint and Kay, Brayden and Theran. She is also survived by her sister-in-law, Oma Whipple,

brother-in-law Eb Whipple and numerous nieces and nephews. She is also being remembered by her caregiver of six years, Tracy Axton.

A graveside service is planned for Saturday, January 16th, 11:00 am at the Ft Jones Cemetery. A potluck social will follow at the Fort Jones Community Center.
