January 7, 1919 - June 8, 2011

Stanley Edward Jantzer, a long-time resident of Mount Shasta, went home to be with the Lord on June 8, 2011 at age 92.

He was born in Glendale, OR on January 7, 1919 to John and Sylvia Jantzer. On August 13, 1939 he married Irene Nye. They celebrated their honeymoon at the San Francisco World's Fair.

He served in the United States Army during WWII in the Philippines, and when the war ended was part of the Allied Occupational Forces of Japan. He received a purple heart and a bronze star.

In his earlier years, Stanley worked as a truck driver, gold miner, logger, and in lumber mills. Upon his move to Mount Shasta in 1957, he was involved with the founding, construction and operation of Cooper's Mill. He was the co-owner of Siskiyou Cedar Products, and later retired as a mill engineer for P & M Cedar Products, Inc.

Stanley enjoyed photography and captured many wonderful memories shared while RV traveling around the United States with Irene. He loved Hope Community Church and enjoyed serving the Lord by helping others.

He is survived by his sons and daughter-in-laws; Glen and Lynda Jantzer of Mt. Shasta, CA, and Mark and Alysia Jantzer of Lakehead, CA; his daughter and son-in-law, Bill and Jo Anne Walker of Mt. Shasta, CA; his brother Ben Jantzer of Grants Pass, OR; 3 grandchildren; and 6 great-grandchildren .

Stanley was a man of God who will be greatly missed.

He was predeceased by his wife Irene of 64 years; his eldest son John; and

grandsons, Kevin and Scott Jantzer.
