Longtime Montague resident Wanda May Cozine passed away on November 15, 2020 with her husband and family at her side. She passed away at her home, peacefully, after battling life after a stroke, on November 26, 2016. She was 88 years old.

Wanda was born in Eldorado, Kansas on June 12, 1932. Her parents, Waskey and Susie May Walls and her brothers, Waskey Jr, Ronald, Donald, and Larry Walls, and her sister, Charlotte Franks have preceded her in death. Her youngest sister, Georgia Zink lives in Yreka.
