



## William Arlo Doughman

March 11, 1935 - May 31, 2015

Eighty years ago on March 11, 1935, William Arlo Doughman, known as Bill Doughman, was born into this world in Morrow, Ohio to Arlo Abraham Doughman and Eunice Grace (Shultz). He graduated high school in Morrow, and later joined the United States Air Force where he received a metal for good conduct and met his wife, Glenda Sue (Bennett). They married April 6, 1957 in Sanger, CA and celebrated their 58th wedding anniversary this past April. In Yreka, CA, they raised their three children: William Arlo "Skip" Doughman, of Springfield, OR; Mark Gregory Doughman, of Chico, CA; and Kari Lee Cooper, of Clemmons, NC. Bill spent his 46 years in Yreka involved in coaching little league, bowling, the Elks, hunting, fishing, golfing, and playing poker. In later years, you would most often find him at the Shasta Valley Golf Club working in the clubhouse, playing a round of golf, or chatting with friends. Sadly, he left this world on Sunday, May 31, 2015.

A hard-working man, he began his career as a print smith in Paso Robles, Ca. That occupation, along with the desire to raise their children in a small town, led them to Yreka. He was a print smith at Nolan Litho Print Shop from 1968 until 1982. During those years, he also worked part time at Zippy's Pizza and Siskiyou Lanes. Later he worked full time at Timber Products and Nor-Cal Products.
